## Wordscape - North Shropshire

Throughout the summer we have been working with teenagers from Wem to create a DVD of the myths of North Shropshire. In an intensive end of term project seventeen 11 to 13 year olds took part in storytelling training workshops led by Susanna Oldfield and Anna O'Brian at Mythstories. Then they learned to tell their



local stories and were then filmed telling them on location at the mythsites.

STWYtellers - Shropshire Telford & Wrekin Young storytellers - have carried on the work over the school holidays. Together they have produced material for a DVD of stories from Oswestry, Whittington, Ellesmere, Whixall Moss and, of

course, Wem.

The DVD will be distributed free to Primary Schools in the North Shropshire area so the stories will carry on being told. You can see the videos for yourself on the stwytellers channel on Youtube.

## Spreading The Word - Mechanically



A TOWN museum has received over £17,000 to develop its storytelling activities, as its owners relocate to new premises in Wem.

Mythstories Museum of Myth and Fable, run by curators.

Dez and Ali Quarrell, has been moving from strength to strength in the town for the past three years.

Now the couple has decided to relocate to expand the business, bringing storytelling to more people in the community. Mythstories Museum closed its doors in Shrewsbury on Monday but its story will continue.

#### 'Opportunities'

Mythstories' new home will be the Morgan Library, Wem, and the grant from the Regional Arts Lottery Programme will help to fund new projects in the North Shropshire Area. Ali told the Chronicle: "We're sad to say goodbye to so many friends in Shrewsbury but are really excited by the opportunities this move provides.
"Our new home will be the Morgan Library in Wem, a beautiful building with a long tradition of valuing stories and their relevance to the local community; ideals which we hope to reflect in our practice."

Mythstories hopes to open for schools and group bookings in its new home after the Autumn half term. It will be reopening to the general public in April 2002.

"We've spent most of 2001 searching for our new home and we are delighted by the practical support received from

both North Shropshire Dis-trict Council and Oswestry Borough Council.

"We are also indebted to Shropshire County Council for their positive assistance in making the charity's goals
