

EDUCATIONAL GROUP SAFETY STATEMENT

We want your class to have an enjoyable learning experience.

WHAT WE OFFER

Your class will have a guided visit, including stories, that will last about 2 hours

You are expected to always supervise children to ensure their safety and good behaviour.

We recommend you bring one adult per six children, but we trust you to decide on the right level of support for your class.

The collection has objects of interest to all ages from pre-school to university level. We will shape the visit to suit your needs and your pupils' interests and abilities.

HOW TO ARRANGE YOUR VISIT

GETTING TO THE MUSEUM

Mythstories is housed within University Centre Shrewsbury's Guildhall Campus adjacent to Shrewsbury's Frankwell Car Park. The carpark is busy and the River Severn runs alongside. Children will require supervision at all times.

BY COACH: There is a designated coach park by the Frankwell Footbridge. The UCS main entrance is in the corner of the building nearest to the Frankwell Footbridge. Access is by external ramp or internal stairs.

BY TRAIN OR BUS: Shrewsbury train station is a ten minute walk from UCS. Go across the pelican crossing at the exit of the train station and proceed towards and along Smithfield Road, keeping to pavements on the 'town' rather than the 'river' side. There is another pelican crossing at the entrance to Shrewsbury bus station, and a bus pull in lane. Children will need close supervision to cross this pull in lane. Continue past the Premier Inn and go over the river at the Frankwell Footbridge to arrive at the designated crossing point to UCS main entrance.

GENERAL INFORMATION

We welcome questions from, and conversation with, your pupils during their visit..

We respect each pupil's individual needs. If you have any particular concerns about any of your pupils, please discuss these with us before your visit.

The collection is displayed throughout the University building with stairs and lifts available to all areas.

Toilet facilities for able and disabled visitors are available throughout the building.

There is a public courtyard garden area within the confines of the building where your class can picnic and plentiful picnic tables available by the River Severn on Frankwell Quay.
